- Thank you Dr. Hernandez. My name is Roman Mendoza, and I am in the fourth grade at Faye Webb Elementary School.
- Today I have the pleasure of telling you about two amazing people who
 <u>continue</u> to volunteer at our school ... even though their own children
 moved on from Webb Elementary <u>years ago</u>!
- Mr. John Garcia and Mr. Cal Martinez are awesome. They help plan our fall festival each year, and spend all night cooking all the meat used in their <u>famous and delicious</u> Bar-B-Que sandwiches.
- They are both members of the Campus Advisory Team, and both are Watch D.O.G.S alumni. They continue to serve as advisors to the committee chair and assist with our annual kickoff nights.
- One year they led a group of Watch D.O.G.S. to beautify our school and redo the landscaping – they are always trying to encourage others to volunteer and partner with our school!
- Every December they help construct our Christmas Village donated by Mrs. Webb's family...a collection which consists of over 300 pieces.
- They also help with our annual Polar Express event ... they always make the **best hot cocoa**!
- This school year, one of our beloved teachers fell ill with cancer ... when a fundraiser was planned, Mr. John and Mr. Cal were first to volunteer.
- Their selfless acts help make our school the best it can be ... and they make a difference that has really built a sense of community for us.
- So, on behalf of CCISD and Faye Webb Elementary School, it is my pleasure to present the Advocate for Partnerships Award to Mr. John Garcia and Mr. Cal Martinez!

DR. ROLAND HERNANDEZ - James A. Ragan Leadership Award

- Great job, thank you Roman and I'd like to thank Mr. Garcia and Mr. Martinez for going 'above and beyond' to serve our students.
- Now, before moving on to the final recognition today, I do have one presentation to make myself.
- There is one i-Achieve award that is meant to recognize a <u>CCISD</u> student who builds partnerships by supporting the community in various ways ... and also works for the benefit of their fellow students.
- This award is very appropriately named the <u>James A. Ragan Youth</u>
 <u>Leadership Award</u> dedicated to the memory of a former student who
 really understood what it meant to give back and make a REAL
 difference in our community.
- Many of you remember or have heard of James Ragan, founder of <u>Triumph Over Kid Cancer</u>; advocate for our community and our young people; and a lasting voice who gave us an example through his life and legacy that we can do **anything** when we work together.
- The Ragan family has made a very generous commitment to provide a scholarship <u>each year</u> to the recipient of the <u>James A. Ragan Youth</u> <u>Leadership Award</u>.
- So today, the winner will receive not only the award, but also a scholarship check for \$3,500 from the Ragan family.
- This year's award recipient is a student who, much like James, takes initiative and makes it his personal, everyday priority to help others.

- He is an excellent role model, and is President of the Key Club at his campus.
- He volunteers in a number of ways, from Beach to Bay Clean-Up's to drug awareness festivals, and from Election Day at the County Courthouse to events serving the Special Olympics.
- He has a long-standing commitment to volunteer at Christus Spohn Hospital and the Corpus Christi Nursing and Rehabilitation Center. As a hospital volunteer, he has cleaned ER beds and changed sheets (which is not something you would find a typical teenage boy doing with his free time ... especially on the weekends).
- In his own words, our award recipient has said: "I enjoy visiting the hospital on Saturdays and Sundays to visit the elderly and read to them, play games, sing, pray and make them laugh. I go because I love the feeling that I made a difference in a person's life by giving them some joy and hope."
- Truly, if anyone knows the definition of "hope," it is this young man.
- He had to overcome many obstacles during his young life, including Dyslexia and AD-HD; having a parent with bouts of epilepsy;
- ... residing in a local neighborhood that could often be dangerous;
- ... and enduring the struggles of being homeless.
- Despite these incredible challenges, this young man had a vision for his life that was bigger than his reality.
- He wanted to attend Texas A&M University and study to be doctor so that he could help others ... and he knew it would take fierce determination to get there.

- So ... he applied for a transfer to a school outside of his neighborhood and away from everyone he knew. He joined the AVID college prep program at his high school and worked extremely hard on his grades.
 Soon he was taking honors and dual credit classes, and has been successful in maintaining a very high GPA.
- Now in his senior year, this young man is in the top 10% of his class, and he has earned admission to the college he always wanted to attend.
- Today he is a mentor and tutor for freshman students in the AVID program. They learn from him and look up to him.
- Together with his fellow students and mentees, they celebrated his achievements as he received acceptance letters to several colleges (including Texas A&M), and when he was honored as a Caller-Times Distinguished Scholar and the recipient of the Congressional Youth Leadership Council Award in 2013.
- ... and today, I would ask that you join me in recognizing a very worthy recipient of the 2015 James A. Ragan Youth Leadership Award – please welcome Jose Puente from W.B. Ray High School!

ALEZABETH CADENA – Moody High School

- Thank you, Dr. Hernandez. My name is Alezabeth Cadena and I am a junior at Foy H. Moody High School.
- I am also a proud member of the Citgo Innovation Academy, and let me
 just tell you, these past three years have been the <u>best years</u> that I could
 have ever imagined!
- Our Academy is made up of mostly minority students who, by virtue of their socio-economic status, cannot afford to pay for trips and supplies needed to maximize their experiences in the academy. Understanding our needs, CITGO Corpus Christi Refinery makes sure that we receive funding so that we do not miss out on those opportunities.
- CITGO helped fund the first ever district-wide GEMS (which stands for "Girls Engineering Math and Science") conference last month. This is an event designed to encourage girls in middle school to consider new careers – sending the message that you do not have to be a boy to become an engineer, a mathematician or a scientist.
- They also funded our very popular trip to the University of Texas Marine Science Institute.
- This is one of the highlights of our freshman year. We stayed overnight
 and then went on a research boat where we learned, hands-on about
 the complexity in marine life it was an awesome experience!
- I am also really involved with our MATE competition for Underwater Robotics!
- Last year CITGO helped fund the MATE competition ... and our Innovation Academy won at the state level, and went on to represent Texas in the International competition in Michigan!

- This year, I am a very proud, <u>female</u> member of the Aquabot Technicians, a team that just competed in the ranger level at NASA's buoyancy lab – and guess who helped fund this opportunity?
- Yes indeed, it was our friends at CITGO Refinery!
- CITGO is truly "fueling good" in our community through our Academy, and also through thousands of dollars in donations to help other CCISD campuses and students.
- Since 2012, they have also awarded CITGO First in Family Scholarships at the school district's annual 'First in Family Graduate Ceremony,' hosted by the Corpus Christi Education Foundation.
- It's not just about the monetary donations, though it's about the
 overwhelming support they provide as advocates for education. CITGO
 believes in us, and they are helping us realize our full potential to lead
 and to serve ... one day, I hope to follow their examples and do the
 same.
- Now on behalf Of CCISD and the Foy H. Moody High School CITGO Innovation Academy, I'd like to present this year's award to some business partners who TRULY GO ABOVE AND BEYOND for our students – the good people at CITGO Corpus Christi Refinery!
